Go online at Copenhagen Airport

How do I find a PC at the airport? Is there Internet access? Can I send an e-mail? Is it possible to print out a document?

Before, Internet access was possible only for passengers with access to the airport's business- and first-class lounges. Copenhagen Airport now offers Internet access that can be used by all passengers.

If you have your own laptop with you, the area between Gates C1 and C9 now features ports where you can plug in and go online. Our local mobile network can be used by anyone with a laptop or PDA with a wireless access card. Until 1 November, Internet access through our local network is free; after that date there will be a charge, payable by credit card.

Passengers not carrying their own mobile device can use one of the airport's nine free-standing PCs. High-speed Internet access is available from these computers, along with all the other features PC users are familiar with, including e-mail, word processing, spreadsheet, presentation graphics, electronic postcards and online gaming. Each computer has a printer and CD-ROM and disk drives.

The airport's nine PCs can be found in the transit area and the airport piers. Fees for these services are payable by credit card.
