Copenhagen Airports A/S joins e-business collaboration

Copenhagen Airports and several other of the world's major airports have established a collaboration to explore the opportunities for creating an international e-business-based alliance for airports. Called World Airports, the new alliance includes the following airports:

- Paris (including Charles de Gaulle and Orly)
- BAA (including London Heathrow, Gatwick and Stansted; Edinburgh, Glasgow and Aberdeen)
- Dallas – Fort Worth International Airport
- Houston (including George Bush International, William P. Hobby and Ellington Field)
- Indianapolis International Airport
- Melbourne International Airport
- Pittsburgh International Airport
- Copenhagen Airports A/S

Tokyo Narita attended the initial meeting as an observer.

About 430 million passengers annually travel through these airports, whose combined investments in infrastructure expansion and development run into the billions of dollars every year.

Members of World Airports will be able to improve their service to customers around the world by offering an independent Internet-based service (with access either by PC or a mobile source) with links to airports all over the world, which will allow passengers to optimise their travel planning.

Alliance members are convinced that their collaboration will create value not only for customers and member airports, but also for suppliers, through optimum utilisation of the opportunities offered by the Internet and through further e-business development.

World Airports expect that other airports will join the alliance as it grows and develops.
