

Do you have any liquids in your carry-on baggage?



From Monday, 6 November 2006, you may only carry a limited quantity of liquids in your carry-on baggage when travelling from an EU airport.

If possible, please pack your toilet bag and ALL liquids in the baggage you are going to check in.

The following rules apply to carry-on baggage:

- You may carry liquids, gels, sprays, lotions, cosmetics, toothpaste, etc.* in containers with a maximum capacity of 100 millilitres (equivalent to 100 g) each.
- You may carry several containers with liquid. The containers must be placed in a sealed, transparent, one-litre bag. It must be possible to open and reseal the bag.
- In addition, for use during the journey you may carry medicine, baby food and liquids that form part of a special diet. You must be able to prove the necessity and authenticity of the liquids to the security staff.
- You must take the bag with liquids and any medicine etc. out of your carry-on baggage and show it to the security staff.
- Generally, you may buy products as usual after the security checkpoint. You will receive the products in a sealed bag, which you may not open until you reach your final destination.

* The definition of liquids and liquid substances includes gels, creams, mixtures of liquids and solids and the contents of pressurised containers, e.g. shaving foam and aerosols. It also includes all forms of drink, toothpaste, hair gel, perfume, lipgloss, mascara and other substances of similar consistency.
